# ECO ECHO: Saving Marine Creatures from Plastic Waste

Earlier this year there was an article about how our plastic waste is impacting God's marine animals. This article is to raise awareness for which types of plastic waste are causing the greatest damage to marine animals. Our source for this article is taken from "Choked, Strangled, Drowned: The Plastics Crisis Unfolding in Our Oceans." It is written for the nonscientist, and I encourage you to download it from the Ocean.org website. The biggest problem Oceana found was animals' consuming plastic, which can obstruct their digestion or lacerate their intestines, leading to an animal's starvation and death. Also, when animals become entangled in plastic, they can drown, choke to death, or suffer physical trauma, such as amputation and infection. Based on their study, Oceana made the following conclusions:

- Bags, balloons, recreational fishing line, sheeting and food wrappers were the most common types of identifiable plastics consumed by these animals.
- Plastic packing straps, bags and balloons with strings were the most common items entangling the animals.

When we look at the types of things that are killing and injuring marine animals, we realize that small changes in our buying habits and how we dispose of things can have a large impact on the health of our oceans.
