NEW LIFESTYLES WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

The New Lifestyles organization describes its mission as "a women-powered community, based in New Haven, Connecticut. Our mission is to use peer mentorship and skill-building workshops to support women facing drug and alcohol addiction, homelessness, reentry into society, and other challenges."

Janice Murray, Director and Founder of New Lifestyles Women Empowerment knows what the women they support are going through.

She and her volunteers offer mentorship from having lived experience with the same things the women they support are living.

Our church has been walking with Janice for the past year in her work with women and men, and in support of her goal to one day have a transitional house for women in New Haven. Together with The Reentry Center at Project More, First Congregational Church and New Lifestyles are searching for a way to work together toward the goal of a house.

Janice Murray also works part time for APT Foundation, which is a treatment and research organization started by Yale School of Medicine in 1970. On Christmas Eve, 2021 we joined with Janice to bring holiday gifts to the women in residential treatment, including some with children and some who are pregnant.

This year we will again contribute to gift bags for 50 women. Items will include hygiene items, hats, scarves and gloves, gently used coats, slippers and lounging clothing to sleep in. We look forward to bringing support to these women who are determined to change their lives.
